Family Talk Time: <u>Celebrating Sunday for Catholic Families:</u>

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us that he is the Good Shepherd. What does a shepherd do? What do sheep need? The Good Shepherd calls us by name. We listen to his voice so that we can follow him. How far does his voice reach?

Reflecting on the Word:

The Good Shepherd loves and cares for the sheep. He knows each of them by name. He calls them and they follow his voice. How do we recognize the voice of the Good Shepherd amid the noise and competing voices in the world? We know the voice of the Good Shepherd because we have heard his great love for us. The great self-sacrificing love that The Good Shepherd has for the sheep reminds us of the love that the parent has for the child.

Living the Word:

We listen to the Good Shepherd's voice and follow him. One of the ways we listen to his voice is by reading his Word. Spend time this week reading about the love and care of the Shepherd in Psalm 23. This psalm tells us that the Shepherd gives us everything we need, including comfort and courage when we are afraid. Have each member of your family illustrate a line from this psalm. Collect all the images to make a Psalm 23 booklet.

Father Marc's Minutes...

The Name of Jesus Saves and Guides

The first reading comes to us from the Acts of the Apostles. Peter has just performed a miracle where a lame man was healed at the temple. People naturally notice this, and a crowd has begun to gather. The Holy Spirit compels Peter to preach to the people about Jesus. Peter boldly announces that the person who healed this man was Jesus the Nazorean. Peter references some Old Testament scripture passages (Isaiah 28:16, Psalm 118:22) and applies them to Jesus. These verses talk about a sure foundation and a cornerstone that is enacted by God. People can depend on this foundation. The cornerstone in a building bears weight and connects walls to each other. The Father has placed Jesus as the cornerstone that holds up the entire building of faith. Peter goes on to testify that salvation only comes through faith in Jesus. Our culture is filled with many religions and may deem it insensitive and lacking tolerance to make a strong claim like this. However, the scriptures echo this truth time and time again. This central conviction of Jesus as the only savior undergirds the entire evangelization effort of Christianity. It matters whether people know Jesus and the consequences are major. If it does not matter, why talk to anyone about Jesus in the first place? The Holy Spirit is inviting us into boldly announcing the Savior Jesus Christ.

We invite people into a dynamic, living, and fulfilling relationship with God and the church. Christ is the Good Shepherd. Christ will lead to fulfillment in life. Christ is not our enemy or opposed to human flourishing but is the pathway to human flourishing. Christ leads us well and is always motivated by love. Even when we are challenged and moved to conversion, Christ does that through love. He is the Good Shepherd who lays down his life for the sheep.

The Importance of Symbols

The Catholic faith and rituals are filled with symbols. Symbols communicate meaning. Let's look at the Apple logo for example. The Apple logo is a simple design that communicates more than just an edible fruit. It has become synonymous with a major tech company that offers high quality machines to make life easier. Some people may

disagree with that, but generally Apple's symbol communicates a deeper meaning. We can identify their products and we have an expectation of performance for an Apple device. Our faith is filled with symbols. The Mass is filled with symbols. The candles indicate the light of Christ and the light of faith. Incense communicates mystery, consecration, and the power of prayer. The tabernacle talks about the abiding presence of God and hearkens back to the meeting tent in the Israelite camp during the wandering in the desert. The lectionary and Book of Gospels communicate the dignity of God's word. The baptismal font communicates spiritual renewal and the sacrament of Baptism. The list could go on and on. I encourage everyone to read and learn about the meaning of our vast array of symbols found in the church.
