Family Talk Time: Celebrating Sunday for Catholic Families, by Sara McGinnis Lee

What does it mean to remain? We hear this word often at Mass today. Listen for this word and think about why Jesus says it so often. We have already listened to his voice and come to him. Now he asks us to remain, to stay with him. How do we do so?

Reflecting on the Word:



Our children desire a close and loving relationship with us. They do not desire things but rather our time with them. They want to put away technology and focus on connecting with them. Their greatest desire is to be in a relationship. Jesus invites us to

remain in him, to be in a close and loving relationship with him. Jesus asks us to stay close to him. Consider how our children's desire for closeness with us can serve as a reminder of the closeness the Lord calls us to with himself.

Living the Word:

We know that a grapevine produces grapes, from which comes grape jelly, grape juice, and even wine. Jesus is the true vine, and we are the branches. If the life and love of the Holy Spirit are inside us, what will be visible on the outside? Will others be able to see what we do and by what we say that the life and love of God is inside us? Enjoy a grape-inspired snack and talk about how you see each family member bearing fruit.

Next weekend, May 4th & 5th after both Masses we will have the Blessing of the Bacramentals. We ask that the children bring the gifts they received for their 1st communion, such as a rosary, a bible, a crucifix, or jewelry, to be blessed by Fr. Marc.

Suspicion in the Church

The first reading shows that the disciples were suspicious of Saul at first. They already knew Saul was consenting to the death of St. Stephen and Saul's reputation preceded him. It took the testimony of Barnabas to have the community accept Saul. Saul joined them in preaching the gospel of Jesus Christ. I just want to reflect on the witness of Barnabas. Barnabas invited Saul into the community. Who can you invite and welcome into the community here at Saint Gabriel Parish? I bet we all know at least one person that doesn't



come to mass regularly or does not attend parish functions. Perhaps the Lord is calling you and I to be like Barnabas and invite them into the community. Let's make it a point to reach out this week.

The Importance of Ritual

Ritual is an important part of life. We have so many rituals in our daily life. We have a ritual for when we work, when we get ready for bed, when we wake up, and many other times throughout the day. Ritual gives a sense of calm and peace. Ritual centers us in the present and becomes a vehicle to deeply encounter others. For example, let's look at birthday celebrations. Most of us have a ritual concerning birthday celebrations. We gather with family and friends, open presents, have some treats and sing a very particular song. This ritual is not boring or tiresome. Instead, it is a way that we celebrate one another and the gift of life.

The Mass is full of ritual. Just like the ritual of birthday celebrations helps us encounter one another, so the ritual of Mass helps us encounter the Lord. We begin with the Liturgy of the Word where we reflect on God's word and allow Him to challenge and comfort us. The second half of the Mass the ritual focuses on the Passover meal and the Eucharist. The ritual provides a context for our identity. If you go to Mass anywhere in the world, the ritual stays the same. We know when to stand, sit, speak, listen, and pray because of the ritual. Let's try and use the ritual to enter the liturgy this week.

In this weekend's bulletin you will notice a flyer talking about Thursday, May 2. We will have our usual schedule of confessions, mass, Eucharistic exposition, and night prayer. We will also have a Catholic young adult group from the area joining us for mass and prayer. They will also lead us in Night Prayer that evening. It should be a beautiful evening of prayer, song, and reflection. I consistently get people testifying about how relaxing that evening is. I encourage everyone to come and be edified

by the Lord.


April is Child Abuse Prevention Month
