

Family Talk Time: <u>Celebrating Sunday for Catholic Families:</u>

What does it mean to remain? We heard this word often at Mass today. Think about why Jesus says t so often. We listened to his voice and came to him. Now he asks us to remain with him. How do we do so?

Reflecting on the Word:

Our Children desire a close and loving relationship with us. They do not desire things, but rather our time with them. They want us to put away technology and focus on connecting with them. Their greatest desire is to be in a relationship. Jesus invites us to remain in him, to be in a close and loving relationship with him. Jesus asks us to stay close to him. Consider how our children's desire for closeness with us can serve as a reminder of the closeness the Lord calls us to with himself.

Living the Word:



We know that a grapevine produces grapes, from which comes grape jelly, grape juice, and even wine. Jesus is the true vine, and we are the branches. If the life and love of the Holy Spirit are

Father Marc's Minutes...

The Call to Bear Fruit

The reading from Acts of the Apostles picks up after St. Peter prays on the rooftop of a home. Peter saw a vision of a sheet descending from the heavens with all kinds of animals and food. The Lord wanted Peter to eat of the food. God was trying to communicate to Peter that all food is now considered clean because Jesus has fulfilled the dietary laws of the Old Testament. There is a second purpose to the vision as well. Through the vision God was preparing Peter to encounter the gentile Cornelius. Peter goes to his house and preaches the gospel. The Holy Spirit comes upon Cornelius and his household. Peter is surprised and rejoices that the Holy Spirit is poured out upon the Gentiles (non-Jews) as well. The Lord healed a little hesitation of Peter about preaching to non-Jews and revealed that God wants all to be saved and come to the knowledge of Jesus.

Movement Matters in Mass

The last several weeks I have written about the Mass and its elements. Today I want to discuss the meaning of movement and action in liturgy. Every action has meaning in the Mass, the rubrics call for movement and action that is reverent, intentional. and meaningful. The procession at the beginning of Mass is about entering the throne room of God. The crucifix leads the procession because we follow Christ crucified as our leader. When I hold my hands to the side in an elevated position, like a "w" shape, that is called the "orans" position. I extend my hands to the side when I am praying on behalf of the assembly. I use this prayer posture for the principal prayers during Mass and the Eucharistic prayer. When I extend my hands over the gifts that is called the "epiclesis," which means calling down the Holy Spirit. The gifts are raised to God after consecration so all may see and be reminded how God has transformed them into something special. We rise to listen attentively to the Gospel, and we sit to reflectively contemplate the other readings. We sing to participate in our common prayer together as the family of God. I encourage everyone to notice what we do during Mass and investigate the rationale behind what we do and believe.

It may be because the process took place during Easter. It may be because I had an opportunity to learn about the Eucharist at evening classes. It may be because I had an opportunity to participate in Adoration multiple times. It may be because of Father Marc's teaching. It may be the love and support that I received from the Parish and my fellow teachers. It may be a gift from the Holy Spirit! All I know is that I am so filled with love from the Trinity and for the Trinity that I want to tell everyone about Jesus and encourage them to follow him and engage in the Catholic Community. If you have not for whatever reason completed the sacrament of Baptism, Holy Communion, Reconciliation, or Confirmation I highly recommend you do. It has changed my life! I will never "not" attend Mass again, and moreover I will encourage others to do so as well! God is so good!
