

## Father Marc's Minutes...

# Food for the Journey

I am a huge Lord of the Rings fan. I was participating in a summer session in preparation for my priestly ordination for nine weeks and I decided to read all three Lord of the Rings books. I could not put the books down and became immersed in the story. I so loved the story that I also read the Silmarillion which talks about events in the first and second age before the other books took place. Anyways, in the books Legolas, one of the elf princes and a warrior, talks about lembas bread. Legolas says that just a single bite of this bread can sustain a person for days. That detail always stuck with me. There is something about this magical or supernatural bread.



This weekend we celebrate the wondrous and mysterious gift of the Bread from Heaven, which is the Eucharist. The Eucharist is foreshadowed so many times in the Old Testament. The manna that

came from heaven to feed the Israelites prefigures the true Bread from Heaven. The Passover meal especially points to the future promise of the Eucharist. In John chapter 6 Jesus lays out his jaw dropping teaching of the sacrament of the Eucharist. He says that we need to take part in the family meal and in the one perfect sacrifice of Christ. Jesus says that this Bread from Heaven is His Body and Blood. The words that He uses are tangible and cannot be mistaken for symbolic language. Jesus was even willing to stake his entire ministry on this fundamental teaching. It says that many of his disciples and crowds no longer followed him after this. It is because of this belief that

we worship the Eucharist and the consecrated elements at Mass as Jesus himself.

The real presence of Jesus is the rationale behind the changes we began this weekend. We kneel to express humility and worship. I also understand that kneeling is not possible in some cases due to health issues. In those isolated instances individuals may be seated instead of kneeling. We will kneel after the "Holy, Holy, Holy" and again after the "Lamb of God." On this solemnity of the Eucharist the Church asks us to especially honor and worship Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. In lieu of a Eucharistic procession we will have time to adore and worship the Blessed Sacrament after Mass for 30 minutes. I encourage everyone to stay and engage in this beautiful prayer to Jesus.

# Christ's Mission Appeal


